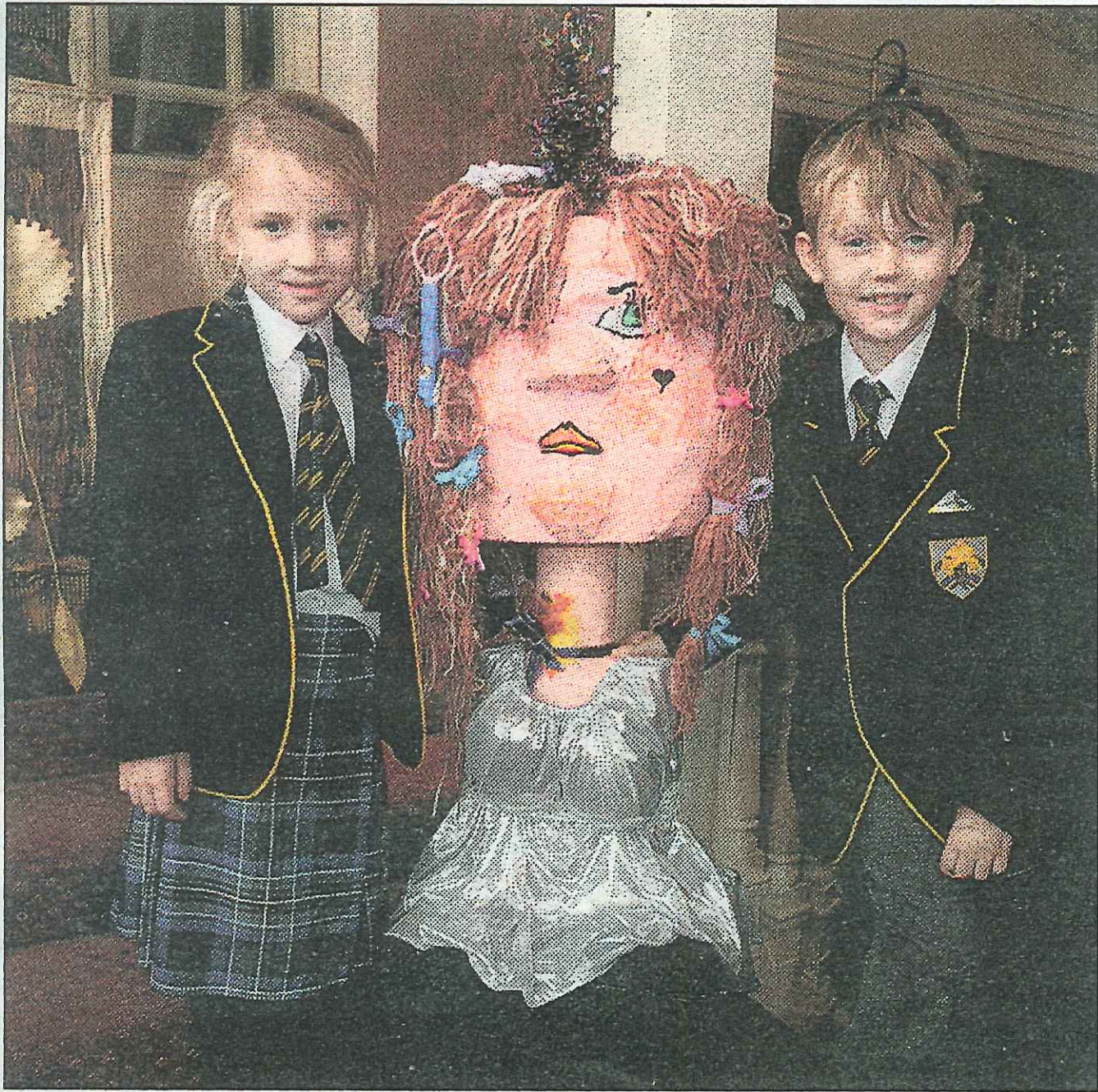


Panto in papier mache!
